

Cambridge School 2022-2023 COVID Guidelines

In response to COVID, Cambridge School has a core set of disease prevention strategies that are routine. The specific prevention strategies, listed below, are directly related to the local <u>COVID Community Levels</u>.

Accommodation	Details
Airflow & Ventilation	 Open windows and doors as much as possible. Fans to increase the effectiveness of open windows when needed. Outdoor snack, lunch, and classes when possible. HEPA Air purifiers/filters used in all rooms. HVAC system modifications have been completed to provide for appropriate ventilation and air flow.
Cleaning, Disinfection	 Cleaning and disinfection of classrooms, restrooms, stairways multiple times during the school day. High touch surfaces in classrooms, restrooms and lunchrooms are disinfected multiple times during the school day.
Communication	LHD: Cambridge is in frequent communication with our Local Health Department. They share resources and information about COVID transmission, as well as best practices for prevention and control.

COVID Exposure in school Delivery of Education Symptom Screening	 After consultation with the Montgomery Township Health Officer, all current best practices for safety will be carefully followed and communicated. Parents of students who are identified as close contacts will be promptly notified regarding the day of exposure as well as appropriate guidelines. In person education only. Parents should carefully monitor their child for the development of any possible COVID symptoms.
Lunch and Snack	 Students should stay home when sick. Snack/lunch periods will take place outdoors weather permitting. Students should bring a beach towel or picnic blanket to store in their locker. US students will continue with off-campus lunch privileges.
Masking	 Masking continues to be one of the important layers of COVID prevention strategies. Masks will be highly recommended and/or required in the following situations: a. During periods of increased risk of transmission b. After returning from isolation c. After a COVID exposure d. If a student develops any symptoms during the school day e. When on school transportation when community levels are high Any student or staff who prefers to mask is encouraged to do so.
School Events & Extracurricular Activities	 Field trips and assemblies have been reinstated Athletic events have been reinstated and will follow the guidelines for numbers of spectators at each game/event. COVID transmission levels in the community will be taken into consideration, but at this time Back to School Night is scheduled to be held in person.
Vaccination	 All staff are required to be up to date with COVID vaccinations. Cambridge tracks the vaccination status of students and staff. This helps to determine the need for



COVID-19 PUBLIC HEALTH RECOMMENDATIONS for K-12 SCHOOLS (2022-2023)



Continue to implement COVID-19 prevention and control strategies:

- Encourage staff and students stay up to date with COVID-19 vaccines.
- Enforce isolation and exclusion for those who have symptoms or have tested positive.
- Exclude students and staff who are not up to date with vaccines and have a household exposure.

IF YOU'RE SICK

(Positive test or COVID-19 symptoms)



Stay Home on days 0-5

regardless of vaccination status



Go back on day 6 if:

- √ Symptoms improve
 - ✓ Fever-free for at least 24 hours
- ✓ Wear a mask through day 10



IF YOU'RE A **CLOSE CONTACT**



COVID-19 vaccines up to date or COVID-19 in last 90 days:

Continue to attend if:

- Asymptomatic
- Wear a mask through day 10
- Testing recommended on day 5



COVID-19 vaccines NOT up to date:

- Stay home through day 5 unless using Test to Stay
- Return on days 6-10 if:
 - ✓ Asymptomatic✓ Wear a mask
 - Testing recommended on
- day 5 *Household contacts not up to

date with vaccinations cannot participate in test to stay.
